# Vocational Education and Training (VET) courses for school students 2026

Updated 14 May 2025

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#### About this information

The following list of VET courses has been developed to ensure school students are able to access quality VET that is appropriate and suitable within a secondary school program of learning. The VET courses have been endorsed by the South Australian Skills Commission as they are industry relevant and support skills development for the workplace.

You can access industry endorsed VET for school students two ways in 2026, either through a Flexible Industry Program (FIP) or via Stackable VET. There are also a number of courses available through a training contract outside of the Flexible Industry Program that are listed on the DIS website.

This document outlines the Flexible Industry Program categories and courses available in 2026, whether the courses are on- or off- the job training (or include a skills cluster), if it is recommended whether they are taken in Year 11 and/or 12, and relevant conditions for VET delivery. Unless an exemption has been approved by the Department for Education, these are the only courses that should be delivered to students enrolled in government schools as part of their secondary program.

Pathways to further education and employment for school students

#### Flexible Industry Programs (FIPs)

FIPs include Certificate II and III VET qualifications that lead to further education and/or entry-level employment in key South Australian industries. FIPs enable a student to commence a VET qualification whilst at school completing their SACE and are a great option for students looking for a skilled career.

FIPs aim to support students into school-based apprenticeships and traineeships. They are aimed at Year 11 and 12 students, include customised SACE subjects and may include <u>Skills Clusters</u> (including pre-employment industry licensing, Advanced Skills Clusters and Skill Sets) to support students to develop skills for work.

#### Stackable VET

Stackable VET options are short courses delivered within a school timetable. They can provide students with pre-vocational skills, work preparedness, and the opportunity to try out different areas before committing to a pathway or provide advanced skills to support students to progress through their pathway. They can be stacked with multiple options for students to explore different areas while developing their skills for work.

#### Pre-vocational qualifications

Pre-vocational qualifications are usually delivered in year 10. They help students explore their areas of interest and the VET environment. They also develop language, literacy and numeracy skills relevant to the workplace and specific industries. Students would generally complete pre-vocational qualifications before commencing a FIP and could use the experience as evidence towards their VET Readiness Orientation (VETRO) requirements.
