If you're thinking of becoming a teacher, nurse, midwife or social worker here's some good news...

The federal government is establishing a Commonwealth Prac Payment of \$319.50 per week to support you while undertaking mandatory workplace placements required for your university or VET qualification.

What are mandatory workplace placements?

For example, if you decide to study social work you will need to do the equivalent of 1,000 hours of work placement, and if you study teaching you must do a minimum 80 days of placement before you're qualified inf your field.

Why are Prac Payments being introduced?

The government is introducing Prac Payments to encourage students undertaking in these courses to complete their training and to help them experience less financial and wellbeing stress while juggling study, paid, and unpaid work.

What are the details?

The payment will be means-tested, so you'll need to meet certain criteria to receive it. It will be available from 1 July 2025 and will be in addition to any other income support you may also receive.

Expanding New Energy Apprenticeships



More good news if you're thinking about starting an apprenticeship! **The federal government is expanding the New Energy Apprenticeships Program** to include a broader range of industry sectors.

From June 1 2024, the changes will expand to assist apprentices and trainees in sectors like housing construction, automotive and advanced manufacturing.

The types of eligible apprenticeships will also expand to include **designing and constructing hydroelectricity**, **solar and battery installations**, **electric vehicle maintenance** and more.

In addition to these expansions, the requirement that an apprentice's work be solely dedicated to clean energy will be removed.

The New Energy Apprenticeships Program covers 40 different occupations and gives apprentices up to \$10,000 in support over the duration of their apprenticeship. Apprentices can also access a New Energy Apprenticeship Mentoring Provider for free career guidance and advice, peer support, and networking to build relationships in the new energy industry.

If you're a young person (17–24), you're eligible for Fee–Free TAFE courses!

Fee-Free TAFE is a joint initiative of the Australian, State and Territory governments, providing tuition-free courses to students in areas of national priority. While your tuition fees are covered by the government, there may be costs such as amenity fees, student services and books or materials required for study, so ask your TAFE provider about additional costs.

You can study an accredited diploma, certificate or short course in a range of industry sectors with skill shortages or growth areas such as:

- aged care, childcare, health care and disability care
- · technology and digital
- hospitality and tourism
- construction
- agriculture
- sovereign capability, for example defence and manufacturing industries
- VET workforce.

Completing training in these high-priority areas will guarantee you graduate with sought after skills and strong job prospects.

Commonwealth Supported Places


If you're considering university, you need to understand Commonwealth supported places vs. full-fee places.

Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP)

A CSP is a place at a university or higher education provider where the government pays part of your fees. It is a subsidy, not a loan, and you don't have to pay it back.

The subsidy doesn't cover the entire cost of your course. The remaining portion is called the 'student contribution amount', which you need to pay upfront OR with a HECS-HELP loan (which you must be eligible for), and which you will pay back.

To be eligible for a CSP you must be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or a certain type of visa holder and have a <u>USI</u>.



Full-Fee Places

If you're ineligible for a CSP or the course isn't offered with CSPs, the alternative is a full feepaying place. This means the government does not pay the subsidy and you pay the full amount. You may be able to get a <u>FEE-HELP</u> loan to pay the full fees (which you will eventually pay back), or you can try to get a CSP for a similar course through a different provider.


