

This is some digital art that I made using an online photo editor called Photopea. I removed the background of the image, and then edited it.












Chocolate Chunk Banana Muffins

Chicken Noodle Stir Fry

Choc Chunk Banana Muffins

Ingredients

- 1 & 1/2 c of plain flour
- 2/3 c of sugar
- 1 & 1/2 tsp of baking powder
- 1/4 tsp of salt
- 1 c of mashed up banana

- 1 large egg
- 1/2 c or 113g of unsalted butter (melted)
- 1/4 c of milk
- 1/3 c of choc chunks

Method

- Preheat oven to 150°c & line muffin tray with cupcake liners.
- Mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in a large bowl.
- Mix mashed bananas, egg, melted butter & milk in a medium bowl.
- Stir banana mixture into the dry ingredients until just combined.
- Stir in choc chunks.
- Divide the batter between the cupcake liners, fill them up until about 3/4 full.
- Bake until the tops are a pale gold or about 30 minutes.

Chicken Noodle Stir-Fry

Ingredients

- Noodles (Udon)
- 86g Carrots
- 136g Broccoli
- 130g Snow peas
- 3 Button Mushrooms sliced
- 93g or 1/2 a Bok Choy
- 1 Chicken breast
- 1 Onion (red or yellow)
- 4 cloves Garlic
- Ginger

For the sauce:

- 1/4 c Soy sauce
- 2 tbsp Mirin
- 1 1/2 tbsp Hoisin
- 1 1/2 tbsp Brown sugar
- 2 tsp Cornstarch

Chicken Noodle Stir-Fry

Method

- 1. Prep your chicken & veggies by chopping them into bite-sized pieces.
- 2. Prep sauce by adding all the sauce ingredients into a bowl or jug and whisk until combined.
- 3. Heat oil in a wok. Then add your meat to the wok and stir until cooked all the way through before removing from the wok.
- 4. Using the same wok add your onions, garlic and ginger. Stir until lightly cooked.
- 5. Add veggies to the onions and cook until soft but not overly soft or mushy.
- 6.Once cooked, add chicken, noodles and sauce. Stir until everything is heated/re-heated and well coated.
- 7. Garnish with spring onions & sesame seeds then serve.

Note: Once the sauce is added to the stir-fry if it is too thin just add a little more cornstarch and of it is too thick and gluggy add a little water.
