Training Pathways

Why MADEC? As a Nationally Registered Training Organisation, MADEC has an excellent history in providing quality and engaging training to school students in a range of courses and qualifications through South Australian Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS). MADEC VETsteps will help you achieve your South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) credits and to gain a qualification during year 11 and 12 so you can work in an industry straight out of school and beyond.

VETsteps Presentation: In years 8, 9 and 10, you can participate in an interactive information session about our qualifications and training pathways that you can study in years 11 and 12 to gain your SACE.

You will receive a certificate of participation.

Work Experience: Allows you to get experience in an industry while at school to see if that pathway is something you would like to do in the future. It is important to choose an industry that you are interested in, because work experience reports will become the basis of your VETRO evidence.

School Expo: Your school may host a careers and employment expo or a pathways evening. At these expos, you can meet with MADEC where we will be happy to answer any questions you have about our courses and to chat about your potential future pathways.

Come and Try Activity Session: Participate in some fun activities and talk with one of our industry expert MADEC trainers! This "Come & Try" day is the perfect opportunity to see if the course is a right fit for you.

You will receive a certificate of participation.

School Subjects: Does your school offer a subject that relates to your chosen pathway? Such as Child Studies? Completing this subject will help build your VETRO evidence.

Skills Cluster Short Course: These short courses lead to full qualifications and provide you with units of competency and some SACE credits.

You will receive a statement of attainment for all units successfully completed.


Qualifications: A nationally recognised certificate with MADEC will allow you to work in an industry as soon as you finish school and can lead to employment, further qualification and university pathways. All come with SACE credits upon completion, which you can achieve with your other subjects at school.

You will receive a certificate if the qualification is completed in full.

CHC22015 - Certificate II in Community Services

This qualification may be used as a pathway for workforce entry as community services workers who provide a first point of contact and assist individuals in meeting their immediate needs. At this level, work takes place under direct, regular supervision within clearly defined guidelines.


Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care Certificate III in Individual Support



White Card

This qualification is mandatory for working in the construction industry, as the course content provides the skills to identify and manage risks to health and safety in the workplace. In addition, you will learn to demonstrate personal awareness and knowledge of health and safety legislative requirements, in order to implement safe work practices to minimise the risk of injury or harm to you, and others in your workplace.

*Year 10 students, under 16 years of age may be accepted for this course.



Learner Support Services



• Do you have some life challenges such as depression, health, relationship, financial pressure, family violence, legal issues or substance abuse?

• Do you need assistance with time management, organisation, planning, understanding course material or assessment instructions?

• Do you feel stressed, anxious, or overwhelmed thinking about trying to maintain your lifestyle, school and enrolling in a qualification?

You may have barriers to your learning, but that doesn't mean you can't study and succeed! MADEC are here to help you with the Government-Funded program, Learner Support Services (LSS).

What is LSS?

Learner Support Services (LSS) offers one-on-one support to students who are finding it hard to keep studying or to keep up with their training. You can contact an LSS case manager yourself or your training provider can refer you.

Learner Support Services aim to support you to stay in training and finish your studies by:

- Supporting you to tackle life issues that might stop you from training
- Offering support to develop your study skills
- Finding support services in your community
- Helping you to understand the training system
- Supporting you after you finish study while you move to further study or into work

This means that you will be able to talk to and work with a qualified case manager, in one-on-one sessions. Your case manager will support you through your studies and can also refer you to other service providers that could support you. LSS services can come to where you need support (outreach service), if needed.

While support for you to develop your study skills can be provided, LSS does not provide Literacy and Numeracy (L&N) training. The training provider you are enrolled with will have already assessed any gaps in your L&N skills and will arrange for free support if you need it.

Placement

Placement provides the opportunity to put all your theory and workshops learning into practice. Placement is a requirement of the qualifications. If you do not complete all of your required hours, you will not be able to complete the qualification, even if you have done all the theory work. This means there may not be any SACE credits.

Students are encouraged to secure their own placement as you will need to negotiate the start dates, times and shifts. Placements are expected to commence in term one school holidays.



Blended Delivery

TEAMS class 1 day per week (8:45 am – 4:00pm)

Students are required to secure their own placement

Compulsory workshops held at a MADEC site

Please note:

- Additional regional loading will apply
- Weekly Teams sessions and workshops are compulsory
- Trainer will visit the student at placement to sign off competencies
- Regional students will be required to travel to a MADEC site for First Aid and workshops
