Message from the Head of Campus



A life without excitement and challenges is a life half-lived?

In 2022, SOTA experienced two main challenges: CoVID restrictions and storm damage to our buildings. However, what we gained and achieved far outweighed these challenges.

SOTA implemented several new initiatives this year. Twice weekly verbal feedback sessions to individual students, weekly Social Space: 'Galah Session', Thursday homeroom, breakout rooms in WebEx, team-teaching in Years 4/5 and flipped learning in Year 6 contributed to overall student learning and wellbeing growth. In addition to the positive supervisor feedback on these initiatives, results from the Department Wellbeing and Engagement survey of years 4-6, NAPLAN, PAT and Running Record indicate encouraging outcomes too. When teachers, supervisors, students and parents work together, we gain positive educational outcomes.

Let's maintain the progress. I hope parents will continue to encourage children to read. Books open up children's imaginations, enrich their perspectives and help them see how language is used to communicate ideas and emotions. If your children are not avid readers, find books that are of their interest (including jokes, comics, sports and magazines) and within their reading level. If it's too hard, they would be overwhelmed by the text and resist reading. Set a daily reading routine – perhaps start with 10mins of reading after breakfast or before dinner in the first week of the holiday, then increase it to 15mins for the next two weeks, and 20mins in the last two weeks. Praise them for reading and ask them to share what they are reading too.

As we head towards the summer holidays, we bid farewell to Beau, Sam and Todd who will be going to new schools next year. We also give thanks and farewell to Miss Sara, Miss Tennessee, Ms C and our longest-serving itinerant teacher, MK. We wish them an enjoyable and rewarding new chapter of life.

In 2023, we will welcome 6 Reception students, 4 new families and 3 new teachers. Miss Emma has been supporting the kindy students transition to SOTA and looks forward to teaching them in Reception next year. We also welcome back Miss Jo, and are delighted to have Miss Morley and Miss Kaur to join Miss Emma and Ms Mel to complete the class teaching staff. Miss Megan is still waiting for a fellow itinerant teacher to mentor and trade travel stories.

My thanks to the teachers, SSOs, supervisors and parents for your work in supporting student learning and providing them with an enjoyable school experience. Your effort has been worthwhile.


Miss Emma's Reception/ Year 1

I wish all SOTA families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! I can't wait to see you all again in 2023!


