
CGC will be discussing the recurrent funding, year 7 – high school, communication and numerous other agenda items throughout first term and the rest of the year.



Reading opens the doors to so many things in life. We want to encourage everyone to find something they can enjoy reading.



I will be teaching Bonnie elastics next week and I look forward to showing all the children how to play.



Year 3:



MISS TENNESSEE'S YEAR 4 & 5



We have also begun looking at the First Fleet. We have learnt about what life was like for kids back in 1700 Britain and compared it to our life in 2021 Australia.

We have an assortment of activities to share with you all this week. In Art we explored the Elements of Art and used famous paintings to identify different elements. In our integrated lessons we have explored the forces that circus performers use, with a particular focus on *push and pull* forces. We are also exploring different types of businesses, include the manufacturing, merchandising and service businesses, with students producing their own creative business ideas . Finally, in English we have been studying the short story *A Sound of Thunder* and identifying key features of narratives.

NEW PRINTER INFORMATION

Hello Everyone,

Just a few things to note regarding the new Brother printers, as I am now rolling them out on a weekly basis with the assistance of Michael, Megan and Eric.

When you receive the printer, please follow the included guides to connect it to your computer(s) and wireless network. If you encounter the message "**Print Unable ZC**" or any other errors when using the device, please inform me immediately.

If you find that documents are printing with excess toner, horizontal/vertical lines or smudging, please try the following:

- 1. Turn on the printer and tap the **Toner Supplies button** in the *bottom right*
- 2. Tap Calibration > Calibrate and wait for it to finish, then tap Registration > Yes
- 3. Try printing some documents (note that you may need to print several pages before the issue gradually alleviates)
- 4. If the problem persists, note the colour of the excess toner (usually black)
- 5. Replace the corresponding cartridge with the included spare, then follow Steps 2 & 3 again
- 6. If the issue persists, please let me know

Once you have confirmed that the new Brother printer is working, please contact me so that I can remove the old Fuji Xerox printer (if applicable) from our system and make it yours! In this case, we will no longer support the old Fuji Xerox printer and will instead support the new Brother printer, including setup assistance and toner requests. If you do not wish to keep the old Fuji Xerox printer, please contact SOTA to organise a return.

If issues are encountered with the new Brother printer, we will organise a return at your earlier convenience and continue to support the Fuji Xerox printer until an alternative can be provided.

Finally, please retain all packaging, materials and resources included with the Brother printer. While these printers are reliable and robust, please cover it when not in use as excess dust infiltration will result in early failure. The included plastic bag is perfect for this.
