5 Reasons to Attend Open Days

If you're in Years 10 - 12, now's the time to start investigating VET and/or Higher Education institutions by visiting open days and attending other events, and these are 5 reasons why:

1. Starting research in Year 10 helps you choose senior subjects so you have the prerequisites for courses you'd like to apply for.

2. Having plenty of time to thoroughly check places out or visit them multiple times is important if you change your mind about what or where to study.

3. You could feel more focused throughout Year 12 because you have a clearer idea about what and where you want to go next.

4. Attending multiple institutions' events lets you

compare their campuses, cultures, and courses, which builds your confidence and decisionmaking skills and empowers you to make wellinformed choices.

5. Knowing you've done your research means you can feel positive and confident when it's time to apply for courses and accept offers.

Look for VET and Higher Education events on the careers website calendar, and find university open days and virtual tours under the Post School Options tab of the website.

Attending expos and open days an important ingredient in your career exploration - but what's the difference? And should you go in person or online?

Expos

Career expos bring together multiple organisations, industries, and educational institutions so you can explore a wide range of careers, interact with industry professionals, attend workshops, and gather information about pathways.

Open Days

Open days are organised by specific educational institutions. They provide an opportunity to tour campuses, attend presentations, speak with staff and students, and gain insights into the programs and courses they offer.

In-person

In-person events are vibrant, interactive experiences where you gain a real sense of an industry or institution. You get to collect brochures, participate in hands-on activities, and have face-to-face conversations.

Virtual

Live online events mean you can explore careers and courses from wherever you are and engage with presenters in Q & A sessions or by using the chat. On-demand options allow you to access and revisit content at your convenience.

What Should I Ask?

Speaking to the right people and asking the right questions helps you get the most out of expos and open days. If you're not sure where to start, pick from some these questions that cover all bases:

Career Expo questions:

- What do you love about your job?
- What skills or interests are essential?
- What entry-level opportunities are there?
- What advice do you have for someone starting out?
- What opportunities are there to progress?

Institution Questions

- What student facilities are there? Sporting/gym, shops, cafes, libraries, etc.
- What social and extracurricular opportunities exist?
- What student support services are offered?

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Course Questions

- What's the difference between these courses?
- What pathway options exist?
- Can I defer or take time out?
- What is the assumed knowledge for first year?
- What electives can I choose from?
- How many contact hours are there?
- How much learning is face to face vs. online?
- How much independent study is required?
- Can I transfer and will I get credit?
- What jobs are graduates employed in?
- Does the course offer workplace learning?

Event Checklist

Before

- Research the institution.
- Organise to go with a friend or family member so you have someone to talk to about it.
- Check the schedule, familiarise yourself with the venue map, and plan your visit.
- Know how long it takes to get there - having plenty of time is more enjoyable than rushing.
- Make a list of questions to ask staff and current students.





During

- Attend the sessions and visit areas you're interested in.
- Note the answers to your questions so so you don't forget them.
- Explore the campus and its student facilities to get a feel for the environment.

After

Ask yourself:

- What was it like to get there from where you live? Can you see yourself making the commute?
- Did you like the campus vibe? Can you imagine yourself studying there?
- How did it compare to other institutions' you've visited?

Write down your impressions, so when it comes time to apply, you can remember exactly how you felt about each institution to help order your preferences.


Get Involved
