

HPV vaccine schedule change

From 1 January 2018 the National Immunisation Program will commence a two dose Gardasil® 9 vaccine schedule which will replace the 3 dose Gardasil® vaccine schedule.

2 dose Gardasil® 9 vaccine schedule

All students in Year 8 commencing a vaccine schedule from 1 January 2018 are to be offered Gardasil® 9 vaccine. Two doses should be administered six to 12 months apart.

Gardasil® 9 includes the vaccine types covered by Gardasil® plus five additional Human papillomavirus (HPV) types, extending the protection against disease from HPV

Previous doses of Gardasil® vaccine

These recommendations recognise that some teenagers may have commenced a three dose course of Gardasil[®] vaccine but not completed their course. Gardasil[®] 9 can be safely and effectively used to complete a schedule started with Gardasil[®].

Re-vaccination with Gardasil® 9 is not routinely recommended for those who have already completed a three dose schedule of HPV vaccine.

Recommendations for those who have received one or more doses of Gardasil® vaccine

Number of Gardasil [®] doses previously received	Recommended Gardasil® 9 doses
1 dose	1 dose at least 6 months after previous dose
2 doses with <6months between doses	1 dose at least 6 months after previous dose
2 doses with >6months between doses	No further doses required
3 doses*	No further doses required

^{*}if minimum intervals between doses have been met

Age limitations for Gardasil® 9 schedule

- Aged <15 years 2 doses, with a minimum interval of 6 months between doses
- Aged >15 years 3 doses administered at 0, 2 and 6 months
